Sunday Worship Next Week at GSLC

Next Sunday (1/17) is the 2nd Sunday after the Epiphany. The Scripture readings for that day are: Isaiah 62:1-5; Psalm 128; 1 Corinthians 12:1-11; John 2:1-11. The Praise Band will lead our contemporary worship at the 9:00 a.m. service. The organist will lead our classic worship at the 11:00 a.m. service. Holy Communion will be offered.

TCN Season Four

The next season for Transforming Churches Network begins on 1/10. It will be a 10 week emphasis on "Empowering God's People." The first four weeks will focus on the following 4 themes; 1) Sending (Luke 10); 2) Sowing (Matthew 13:1-23); 3) Missionary Principles (Luke 10 & Acts 8:26-36); 4) Spirit's Power (Luke 10). The last six weeks will be our Lent Theme: "Prayer: The First Step toward Reaching Our Community for Christ."

Lent 2016

The Lent season begins on Ash Wednesday (2/10). The Lent theme will be on "Prayer: The First Step toward Reaching Our Community for Christ." The Lord's Prayer will be the template for our 6 weekday services. Today’s Readings Summaries

A summary theme for the appointed readings today (1/10) is: *The Triune God Opens Heaven to You in Holy Baptism.* The Baptism of our Lord is an “Epiphany” of the one true God in the flesh and blood of Jesus Christ. In divine mercy, He takes His place with sinners and takes their sin upon Himself. “When all the people were baptized,” Jesus submitted Himself to a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins (Luke 3:21). He had no sins of His own, but He took the sins of the world upon Himself and so was baptized into His own death. Therefore, “when you pass through the waters,” He is with you (Is. 43:2). He created you for His glory, and He has redeemed you with His blood, that you may be His own and live with Him in His Kingdom (Is. 43:1, 7). As you are baptized with a baptism like His, so also are you united with Him in His death and resurrection that you “might walk in newness of life” (Rom. 6:4). For all who are baptized into Christ Jesus receive His anointing of the Holy Spirit and are named by His Father as beloved and well-pleasing sons and daughters.

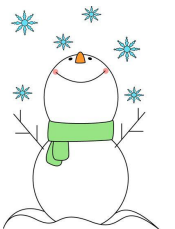
