### Property Team

The team met on 1/20/17.

- Two roof leaks have been repaired for \$640.00.
- Replacing Yale locks with Schlage lock cylinders is being moved to Capital Fund projects.
- A printer in the back office is being replaced.
- Information to re-lamp the Social Hall lights to make them brighter is being obtained.
- The team is considering a handrail for better access for the side entries to the Chancel.
- A deadbolt lock will be installed into the half doors to the Nursery.
- Repairs from water damage will be made to the outside door in the back classroom hallway.
- The windows in the Sanctuary will be re-caulked
- River rock will be placed in planters by back kitchen door.
- The large BBQ grill needs to be replaced. The team prefers 2 smaller gas units with lids.
- The birch trees by the front entry will be removed due to their age and the leaf problem in the drains.
- A new wireless (wifi) network will be installed at a cost of \$1,500. The team will ask the Council for approval of Capital Funds for the expense.
- The fluorescent lights in the offices will be replaced with dimmable LED fixtures.
- The sink in the sacristy bathroom will be replaced.

### Today's Readings Summaries

A summary theme for the appointed readings today (1/29) is: **God Manifests His Glory in the Humility and Weakness of Christ Crucified.** The Lord tells His people, "I brought you up from the land of Egypt and redeemed you from the house of slavery" (Micah 6:4). By the sacrifice of His beloved Son, He has redeemed us from our slavery of sin and death; He has forgiven our transgressions by the shedding of His blood. His great mercy and salvation lead us "to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly" with our God (Micah 6:8). We boast only in the incarnate and crucified Lord Jesus. He is "the power of God and the wisdom of God" (1 Cor. 1:24). He is our life and salvation, our "wisdom from God, righteousness and sanctification and redemption" (1 Cor. 1:30). Now He opens His mouth and teaches us His wisdom. By His cross and Passion the kingdom of heaven is ours, we receive mercy and are satisfied, we see God, and we are called sons of God in Christ. "Blessed are you," therefore, "when others revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely" on account of Christ (Matt. 5:11).
