Sunday Worship Next Week at GSLC

Next Sunday (12/6) is the 2nd Sunday in Advent. The appointed Scripture readings for that day are: Malachi 3:1-7; Psalm 66:1-12; Philippians 1:2-11; Luke 3:1-20. The Praise Band will lead our contemporary worship at the 9:00 a.m. service. The organist will lead our classic worship at the 11:00 a.m. service. Holy Communion will be offered in both services. The Bell Choir will provide music at the 11:00 a.m. service.

Advent/Christmas Season

The theme for our Advent/Christmas worship is *Shatter the Darkness with Song*. Each Sunday will include one of the "songs" from the Bible that are associated with the season. The first "song" is the one from Zechariah, John the Baptist's father (Luke 1:67-79). **The second song, the song for December 6 is the song of Mary (Luke 1:46-55).** The third song is the song of the Angels (Luke 2:8-14). The fourth song is the song of the Church (Matthew 1:18-23). The themes for four Sundays and the four candles on the Advent Wreath will be drawn from the four songs: Repentance – **Remembrance** – Rejoicing – Reconciliation. Join us and bring a friend.

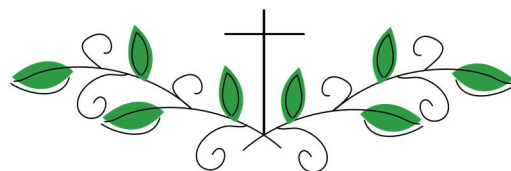


TCN – Stress Kit

When you and I celebrate the coming of the Prince of Peace with joy and gladness, others may be feeling the world crashing in on them, the heartache is too much to bear, the addiction too hard to overcome, or the depression too great. They may be asking “Where is God?” Giving this small package may put a smile on their faces, and give you the opportunity to share the answer they are searching for.

Today’s Readings Summaries

A summary theme for the appointed readings today (11/29) is: *The Lord Jesus Comes in Humility to Redeem Us*. The Season of Advent focuses on the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, and this first Sunday establishes this theme for the rest of the season. The Son of God came long ago to be our Savior, “a righteous Branch,” descended from David (Jer. 33:15). As He then came into Jerusalem, riding on a lowly donkey to sacrifice Himself for the sins of the world (Luke 19:28-40), so does He come to His Church today in the humility of Word and Sacrament to deliver the fruits of His Passion: the forgiveness of sins and eternal life. He absolves us and establishes our hearts, “blameless in holiness before our God and Father” (1 Thess. 3:13). The same Lord Jesus, who came to Jerusalem then, and who comes to us now in peace, will come again with power and great glory on the Last Day. Then there will be “distress of nations in perplexity,” with “people fainting in fear.” Yet, as we anticipate that great and terrible day, He bids us to rest securely in Him: “Raise up your heads, because your redemption is drawing near” (Luke 21:25, 26, 28).
