Sunday Worship Next Week at GSLC

Next Sunday (4/10) is the 3rd Sunday of Easter. The appointed Scripture readings for that day are: Acts 9:1-22; Psalm 30; Revelation 5:1-14; John 21:1-19. The Praise Band will lead the music at 9:00 a.m. The organist will lead the music at 11:00 a.m. The Bell Choir will provide music at the 11:00 a.m. service.

Florence Dayton Memorial Service

The Memorial Service for Florence Dayton is scheduled for Saturday, April 16, 11:00 a.m. It will be followed by a reception in our Social Hall.

Lent Worship Summary

At the last Lent weekday services we handed out a survey to get a sense of how people responded to the time and structure. Also, we asked if the services helped them grow spiritually. The Wednesday 12:30 p.m. service was similar to the services in past years. The other times were structured for use in small group settings. These were the combined findings: Time, 61 liked the time for the service they attended, 2 preferred a different time; Structure, 55 thought the structure was good for them, 7 thought the structure was OK for them, one said the structure did not work for them; Grow Spiritually, 59 thought they grew spiritually through the services, 3 thought they grew somewhat, no one said they did not grow. Thank you to all who participated in the services. We want to provide services that are meaningful and helpful.

Elder Ministry Team

The Elders met on March 28, 2016. Here is a summary of the meeting:

- Care ministry needs were discussed. Several cards were sent.
- Pastor Ron's report focused on information about the BIG Big Band from Sweden that we are hosting on 6/21; health concerns expressed from shaking hands; and the need for making our service more accessible to hearing impaired.
- The youth report was reviewed and need for elder contacts with youth.
- The Lent weekday services were discussed. The survey results taken at the last services were discussed. (Check out that report in N&N.) The consensus was a very positive view of the style and content of the services. The elders will continue discussion in June about possibilities for Lent 2017.
- The revised usher duties were discussed. A few revisions will be made for review at the next meeting.
- A list for people to serve on Elders was reviewed. A few more people are being contacted to serve for a two year term.
- The budget for 2016-2017 was adopted for presentation to the Stewardship Ministry Team.
- The elders adopted one SMART Outcome to address the congregation's Big Rock (Goal) for 2016-2017: Hold an annual social event with the Jr. High and Sr. High to build relationships, discuss service

opportunities and receive feedback about what they would like to get out of the partnership with the Elders.

- A report about safety needs during worship was distributed for discussion at the next meeting.
- The next Elder's meeting is scheduled for April 20, 6:30 p.m. with the Confirmation students.

Today's Readings Summaries

A summary theme for the appointed readings today (4/3) is: *That You May Believe and Have Life in His Name*. On the Lord's Day, St. John the Apostle was given a revelation of the Lord Jesus Christ, the incarnate Son of God, the Alpha and Omega, the First and the Last. He is the Living One, "the firstborn of the dead" (Rev. 1:5). He died for all people, and behold, He is alive forevermore! Therefore, He has "the keys of Death and Hades" (Rev. 1:18). For His death atoned for sin and conquered death, and in His resurrection He opened the kingdom of heaven to us. The "sharp two-edged sword" of His mouth (Rev. 1:16) calls you to "believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God," that by such faith "you may have life in His name" (John 20:31). To that end, He sends His ministers of the Word, as the Father sent Him, "to give repentance to Israel and forgiveness of sins" (Acts 5:31).

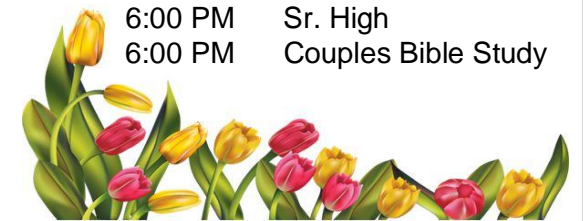
