The Lutheran Church Charities K-9 Comfort Dog Ministry

Comfort, comfort my people, says the Lord. ~Isaiah 40: 1

The aim of the K-9 Comfort Dog Ministry of the Lutheran Church Charities (LCC) is to bring Mercy, Compassion, Presence and the Proclamation of Jesus Christ to those suffering and in need in the local congregation and its community. This LCC K-9 ministry began as a disaster response in 2008 after Hurricane Katrina and currently has about 100 dogs in service or in training. The dogs are 12-18 month old Golden Retrievers who serve as a bridge between the local

Ministries Handler, the Caregiver and the person being comforted and served. The dog is owned by the local congregation and lives in a members home. This dog becomes an integral part of the life and activities of its congregation. The intent of each visit by the Ministries team is to bring comfort and mercy through the presence of the dog and the love of Jesus Christ through prayer.

Current local congregations involved in this ministry are First Lutheran in Yuba City and St. John's in Napa. The dogs are provided and trained for a year to a year and a half in Northbrook, Illinois. These dogs are named and also have their own individual Facebook page. The initial cost of this ministry is about \$15,000, usually raised through local congregational donations. This cost includes the dog; the training for the handler, caregiver and dog, There is also an annual \$99 fee. Most local congregations include the dog on their insurance plans, and usually receive free or low cost services from local veterinarians. Before a congregation can be accepted into this ministry a Ministry Plan must be submitted for approval.
