Elder Summary

The Elders met on Nov. 15, 2016. Here is a summary of the meeting:

- Care ministry needs were discussed.
- Youth participation in the Elder teams was reviewed.
- The Elder budget was reviewed. There are no issues or concerns.

- The new Acolyte schedule from Jen was reviewed. Acolytes now serve on a specific Elder worship team, one Sunday each month.
 - Elder assignments for the special worship services in Advent and Christmas were reviewed.
 - A discussion began about the need to adopt a specific Bible translation for buying new Bibles in the future since the NIV1984 is no longer available. This will continue in January.
 - The following items pertaining to high school youth will be incorporated into the yearly outcomes for Elders: interest in usher training, being reminded by texts when they are to serve as ushers, suggestions for worship and music in worship, a "mush ball" or similar event.
 - The Elder Letter to be mailed in February was reviewed and adopted.
 - The Elders discussed a question from a member about how to address people talking during certain parts of the worship service. No specifics were decided other than recognizing this is a sensitive matter.
 - Weekday services in Lent will be offered in a similar format as last year, one on Wednesday around noon, one on Wednesday evening, one on Tuesday evening and one on Thursday evening.
 - Leadership training was given about visionary leadership.
- The next Elder's meeting is scheduled for Jan. 18, 6:30 p.m. (Jim Bollinger, Ken Fitzgerald, Victor Martino, Derek Schell, Jim Smith, Rick Kaepernick, LeRoy Gonzales, Ken Lambert and Pastor Ron)
