The Lutheran Church Charities K-9 Comfort Dog Ministry

The aim of the K-9 Comfort Dog Ministry of the Lutheran Church Charities (LCC) is to bring Mercy, Compassion, Presence and the Proclamation of Jesus Christ to those suffering and in need in the local congregation and its community. This LCC K-9 ministry began as a disaster response in 2008 after Hurricane Katrina and currently has about 100 dogs in service or in training. The dogs are 12-18 month old Golden Retrievers who serve as a bridge between the local Ministries Handler, the Caregiver and the person being comforted and served. The dog is owned by the local congregation and lives in a members home. This dog becomes an integral part of the life and activities of its congregation.
