Sunday Worship Next Week at GSLC

Next Sunday (2/2) is the 4th Sunday after the Epiphany and the **Presentation of Our Lord**. The appointed Scripture readings for that day are: 1 Samuel 1:21-28; Psalm 84; Hebrews 2:14-18; Luke 2:22-40. The Praise Band will lead our music at the 9:00 a.m. service. The organist will lead our music at the 11:00 a.m. service. The Chancel Choir will provide special music at the 11:00 a.m. service. Holy Communion will be offered at both services.

Lent Worship

The first worship service during Lent is Ash Wednesday. A 6:30 p.m. service will be offered on March 5 with Holy Communion. The following five Wednesdays will offer two services each Wednesday. The 12:30 p.m. services will be a more formal service. The 6:30 p.m. services will be more informal. The theme for the Wednesday services will be the "*Son of God*," which is based on the upcoming movie ("Son of God") that opens in theaters on 2/28. You are encouraged to see the movie before the Lent series begins. The reason for two services is to offer a service for those who prefer a service during daylight hours and to offer a more informal service in the evening time.

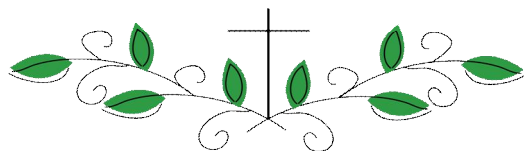

Today's Readings Summaries

A summary theme for the appointed readings today (1/26) is: *The Lord Manifests His Glory through His Office of the Holy Ministry*. By His coming in the flesh and by His preaching and miracles, the Lord Jesus shines the light of His Gospel upon "the people who walked in darkness" and "who dwelt in a land of deep darkness" (Is. 9:2). He has also "multiplied the nation" and "increased its joy" (Is. 9:3) by calling disciples to Himself from the ends of the earth. For this purpose, He calls Peter and Andrew, with James and John, to follow Him and be "fishers of men" (Matt. 4:19). As Jesus did, they also go forth "proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom and healing every disease and every affliction among the people" (Matt. 4:23). They preach the foolishness of the cross of Christ as the very power and wisdom of God. This word and preaching of the cross divides "those who are perishing" from "us who are being saved" (1 Cor. 1:18), but it unites the Church, the one Body of Christ, "in the same mind and the same judgment" (1 Cor. 1:10).

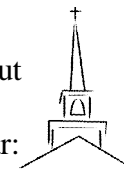

Assistive Listening Devices

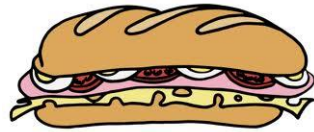
