Sunday Worship Next Week at GSLC

Next Sunday (4/13) is Palm Sunday, the Sunday that introduces Holy Week. The Scripture readings for that day are: Isaiah 50:4-9a; Philippians 2:5-11; John 12:12-19. The Praise Band will lead our music at the 9:00 a.m. service. The organist and Chancel Choir will lead our music at the 11:00 a.m. service. We conclude the Sunday worship theme of **“Sons & Daughters of God: Who are We?”** We, who have been broken by sin, have been restored to the family of God by the Son of God. The sixth Sunday’s theme is **“Injustice/Justice.”**

Lent Worship on Wednesdays “Son of God: Who is He?”

Two worship services are offered on Wednesdays during Lent: a 12:30 p.m. formal, liturgical service and a 6:30 p.m. informal, contemporary service. The overall theme for Wednesday services and Holy Week services will be the **“Son of God.”** The theme for 4/9 is **“Forgive Us... – The Sinner’s Friend.”**

Holy Week Worship

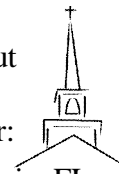
