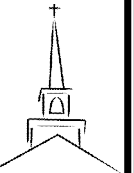

Valerie Stonebreaker's Latest Update

9/24/14

Dear Friends in Christ,

Another month has passed already! It is truly rainy season here now, with rain falling often and heavily. I've not been able to do as much visiting in the villages as I would like, simply because the roads are impassable. I had hoped to visit the literacy sites in Lokpano and Brouk, both in one day, but. . .the rain changed our plans.

I actually left Dapaong on the designated morning, a little after 6:00 am, to meet President Lambon in Nano at 7:00, and continue up the escarpment for the 8:00 class in Brouk. On leaving the house, I said to Dagba, "Oh, it's raining in the president's village!" as the sky was very black in that direction. However, as I'd received no calls, we continued on to Nano. It began to sprinkle a little. We waited at the meeting point for a few minutes; I then sent a message on my cell phone to let the president know we had arrived. He responded that he was on his way. A few minutes later I received a message from Remi, the church treasurer, whose home is on the way. . .he was astounded that I had come in the rain. But it wasn't raining in Dapaong! The president arrived on his motorcycle, soaking wet! I asked him if we should postpone the trip. He called the pastor in Brouk, who responded that it was not raining there: Come. I was hesitant, but the president said, "Let's go!" so we went. Climbing the escarpment was not a problem, but as we continued on to Lokpano, the sky kept getting darker and darker. I told the president that if it started to rain, I was turning back. After passing a few of the really rough places, he commented that yes, if it rained we would not be able to pass. We actually were past Lokpano, nearly to Brouk when President Lambon said, "We need to turn back now. It's going to rain and we'll be in trouble!" I was quite ready to turn around and asked him to call Pastor Kommena while I found a place wide enough to turn around. Pastor Kommena assured us that the rain wouldn't continue, but both the President and I weren't convinced. The rain began falling but thankfully we passed the three places that worried me with no problems. I left the president in Nano, in the rain, and slowly continued back to Dapaong. There were several places we had to pass through deep water, but thankfully my RAV 4 is four wheel drive all the time, and I had no trouble. We arrived safely in Dapaong, four and a half hours later, but we had not been able to visit the literacy classes. Pastor Kommena asked us to reschedule our visit, but I replied that Brouk would be our first visit once the rains stop and the roads are passable again. We'd made a grand effort and the rains were just too much now!

This coming Sunday I plan to visit the Lutheran Congregation in Nano. The literacy class in Nano was my first visit for the project, but I've not attended church there. Pastor DJETOIT has invited me since my return to Togo in 2011, and as I now have a vehicle I will go. . . providing it isn't pouring down rain! The members of the Saongpong congregation will be joining them for the service that morning, so the chapel should be filled and I'm looking forward to the worship service.

Classes for the school children are scheduled to begin Monday, September 29, and there is much activity trying to arrange finances resources for school fees, school uniforms, notebooks, pencils and pens. Many students struggle greatly to find enough money to purchase the necessities and pay their fees. . .but an education is their only hope for the future. I pray that the school year passes peacefully. The presidential election is scheduled for spring 2015; high school students and teachers are often utilized for campaigning, so school is usually closed for a month or so. With so much unrest in the Middle East and the Ebola epidemic in neighboring countries, I pray for peace and health in Togo.

May the Lord be with you and bless you as you serve Him!
