Today's Readings Summaries

A summary theme for the appointed readings today (2/22) is: *Christ Jesus Defeats Our Temptation and Saves Us by His Faithfulness*. In faith and the fear of God Abraham prepared to sacrifice his beloved son, Isaac. At the Word of the Lord, he "took the wood of the burnt offering and laid it on Isaac his son" and "when they came to the place of which God had told him," Abraham bound Isaac "and laid him on the altar" (Gen. 22:6, 9). Then God stayed Abraham's hand and provided "for Himself the Lamb for a burnt offering" (Gen. 22:8). That Lamb is God's own beloved Son, Jesus, in whom "all the nations of the earth" are blessed (Gen. 22:18). As the Substitute for all the sons of men, Jesus is driven by the Spirit "into the wilderness" to be "tempted by Satan" (Mark 1:12-13), in order to endure and defeat all temptation. We are tempted by our own desire, which conceives and "gives birth to sin" (James 1:14-15). But this blessed Man, Christ Jesus, remained "steadfast under trial" and He has received "the crown of life, which God has promised to those who love Him" (James 1:12). His faithfulness, His victory, and His life are now given to us by His grace in the Gospel.

- Care ministry cards were sent and needs were discussed.

- Pastor introduced the elders to the Transforming Churches Network (TCN), a consulting group that will be working with our congregation's leaders over the next year. Information will be presented to the congregation in the near future. The Church Council is overseeing this process.
- New alarm codes were provided by the elders.
- The elder assignments for the midweek Lent services and the process for Ash Wednesday were discussed and finalized.
- An addition was added to the wedding manual.
- Several possibilities were discussed for new elders.

We want to remind the congregation and visitors that assistive listening devices are available for those with hearing issues. An usher or elder can help get the device for you. Please ask.

Property Team

The team met on February 12, 2015.

- The property team recommends we add a rider to our property insurance to include replacement to code when/if it is needed.
- The sidewalk project will be \$13,122.00 (original, \$12,634.00)
- The Social Hall lights will be repaired as needed to replace the current bulb with fluorescent bulbs, which will provide more lumens than the current bulbs.
- Installing cameras on the exterior of the building will be added to the major capital projects list (see below).
- Information is being gathered to certify our building by the Red Cross as an emergency shelter.
- More lighting will be added to the parking lot.
- New projectors will be requested from Capital Funds to replace the two in the sanctuary and the one on the portable cart at a cost of \$6,000. The current ones are about 2-4 years past their lifespan.
- An ADA evaluation of our facility will be done. The cost will be about \$1,900. The team thinks this is necessary to insure our compliance with the complicated ADA laws.
- A list of capital fund projects was reviewed:
 - * Phone system
 - * Replace carpeting/floor coverings (including Youth Central)

- * Paint exterior of the church
- * Chancel lighting
- * Sanctuary duct work
- * Sanctuary seating
- * Church sign
- * Sound system upgrades
- * Exterior security cameras
- The team prepared a Ministry Team report for the congregation in May. (Bob Hoskins, Wayne Rickey, Burt Lindquist, Bill First and Pastor Ron)
