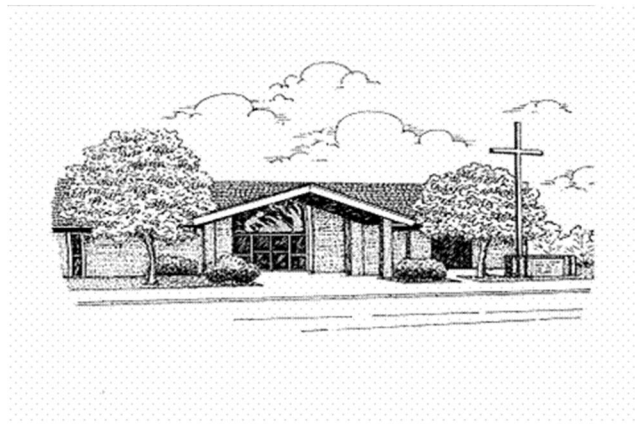

Today's Readings Summaries

A summary theme for the appointed readings today (6/28) is: *The Lord Jesus Is Faithful, and in Mercy He Raises You Up from Death to Life*. The Lord is faithful. His steadfast love never ceases, and "His mercies never come to an end" (Lam. 3:22–23). To keep in repentance and to make our faith grow, He causes grief for a while, but He does not cast off forever; in due time, "He will have compassion" (Lam. 3:31–33). Therefore, "hope in Him," and "wait quietly for the salvation of the Lord," for "the Lord is good to those who wait for Him" (Lam. 3:24–26). That is what the woman did "who had a discharge of blood," and the ruler whose daughter "was at the point of death." Each waited on the mercy of the Lord Jesus, and each received His saving help (Mark 5:21–28). The woman had suffered much for twelve years, and the ruler's daughter had already died before Jesus arrived. Yet, at the right time, the woman was immediately "healed of her disease," and the little girl "got up and began walking around" (Mark 5:29, 42). Such is "the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ," who humbled Himself, unto the extreme poverty of death, "so that you by His poverty might become rich," unto life everlasting (2 Cor. 8:9).
