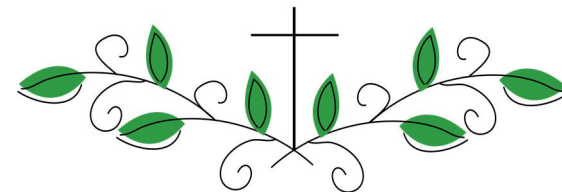


Sonrise Singers

Togo Mission Trip Update

The mission team departs for Togo, Africa, on June 29 and returns on July 9. Our team will visit 4 congregations for a rally day at each location and hold a 2-day seminar for the Lutheran pastors in Togo. Thanks to the generous donations of our congregation, a mission grant from the Church Extension Fund (\$750), a grant from Thrivent (\$1,000), and a gift from Colin Kaepernick's Mayor Prayer Breakfast funds (\$4,000) all funds needed have been received. Today's Readings Summaries

A summary theme for the appointed readings today (6/7) is: *Jesus Has Defeated the Devil and Released Us from the Bondage of Sin and Death*. The devil deceived us, enticing us to disregard and disobey the Word of God, and driving us to hide "from the presence of the Lord God." But the Lord in His mercy promised a Savior, who would set Himself against the devil on our behalf (Gen 3:8-15). The "stronger Man" come, the incarnate Son of God, conceived and born of the Woman. He "first binds the strong man," Satan, by atoning for the sins of the world, thereby removing the condemnation of the Law and the fear of death (Mark 3:27). Now He plunders the devil's house by calling all men to repent. Though He appears to be "out of His mind" (Mark 3:21), He fulfills the will of God and makes of us His own brothers and sisters. Therefore, "we do not lose heart," despite the suffering, sin and death that we experience in this fallen world. "He who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus." By His grace, we are "being renewed day by day." For the Gospel is daily bringing us into His presence, not for punishment, but for "an eternal weight of glory" (2 Cor 4:14-17).

Social Ministry Team

The team met on June 2:

- The team's financial report was reviewed. Everything is in order.
- The Diaper Drive for Verda's House was funded by generous gifts totaling \$251.78. The next drive will be in October.
- Pam Youngdale gave a report about Learning Matters, our adult literacy ministry. It is now one year old. We have developed from 5 tutors to 12 tutors and 10 students. Pam will provide a more detailed report to the congregation at a later date.
- Our weekly prayer cards to LCMS congregations are sent out by several volunteers. The list of volunteers was updated.
- Our correct address for the Cooper House will be provided for the newspaper. Currently it is using a wrong address for NAMI.
- The process for developing SMART goals at the congregational meeting was helpful for our team.
- The Winter Shelter and We Care Men's Shelter has been completed for the season.
- Love Turlock, coordinated by Ayla Dillon, was a successful ministry.
- A Mental Health First Aid Training, led by Ken Fitzgerald, is being held.
- Our congregation is in the process of "filling" 75 baby bottles with money for the Turlock Pregnancy Center.
- Our congregation provided funding to assist a family with a deposit for TID.

- Using our facility as a Red Cross certified emergency shelter is still being considered. We are waiting for more information from the Red Cross.
- Our congregation is planning on hosting a blood drive for Delta Blood Bank. More information will be provided at a later date.
- We reviewed our 4 new outcomes for 2015-2016. They will be further developed in August.
- A list for the GSLC Transportation Corps is being updated. These volunteers provide rides for people with specific needs.
