Sunday Worship Next Week at GSLC

Next Sunday (8/30) is the **14th Sunday after Pentecost**. The Scripture readings for that day are: Deuteronomy 4:1-2, 6-9; Psalm 119:129-136; Ephesians 6:10-20; Mark 7:14-23. The Praise Band will lead our contemporary worship at the 9:00 a.m. service. The organist will lead our classic worship at the 11:00 a.m. service.

Transforming Churches Network (TCN)

Our congregation will embark on two adventures beginning on September 9. Both adventures will help us live out the theme for this year, *“Empowered to Move Out with God’s Love”* from 1 John 3:18, *“Let us not love with words or tongue but with actions and in truth.”* The first adventure will involve devoting 10 weeks (9/9–11/15) to a **Season of Moving Out**. Within those 10 weeks we will focus on *“Living a New Vision”* and *“Sharing the Gospel in Ways that Are Truly Good.”* The second adventure will begin on Jan. 10. The focus for those 10 weeks will be on a **Season of Empowerment**. More information will be made available as we draw closer to our launch date (9/9), which is also Rally Sunday.

Confirmation

Confirmation begins on **Sept. 2, 6:30 p.m.** This meeting is for parents and students in grades 5-8. Our Confirmation instruction is a four year course. The first two years (grade 5-6) provide an overview of the whole Bible. The second two years (grades 7-8) are an in-depth study of the basic teachings of the Bible. 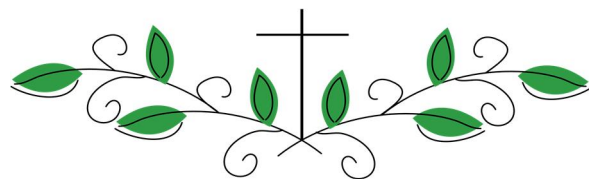
T-Shirts Theme & Logo

Today's Reading Summaries

A summary theme for the appointed readings today (8/23) is: *The True Tradition of the Church is the Ministry of the Gospel of Christ Jesus, Her Savior.* The true tradition of the Church is the Gospel, which is the preaching and administration of Christ Jesus. Other traditions, although not commanded by God, may serve and support that sacred tradition of the Gospel. But the Church dare not "reject the commandment of God" in order to establish or hold to "the tradition of men" (Mark 7:8-9). Sinful people attempt to draw near to the Lord "with their mouth," and to honor Him "with their lips," while their hearts are far removed from Him (Is. 29:13). Yet, He is "the Holy One of Israel," who brings about salvation by His Cross. Therefore, "the wisdom of their wise men shall perish," but "the deaf shall hear," and "the eyes of the blind shall see" (Is. 29:14-19). This mystery of Christ is profound, for He is the Husband of the Church, and He is her Savior. Not because of any works that she has done, but solely for the sake of His great love, "He gave Himself up for her, that He might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word" (Eph. 5:23-25).

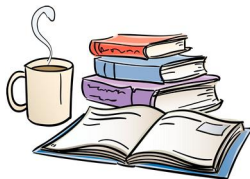
Dish 'n That Potluck Game Night Sunday, August 30

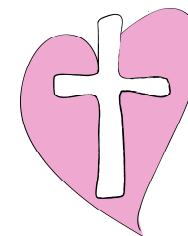

Youth Team

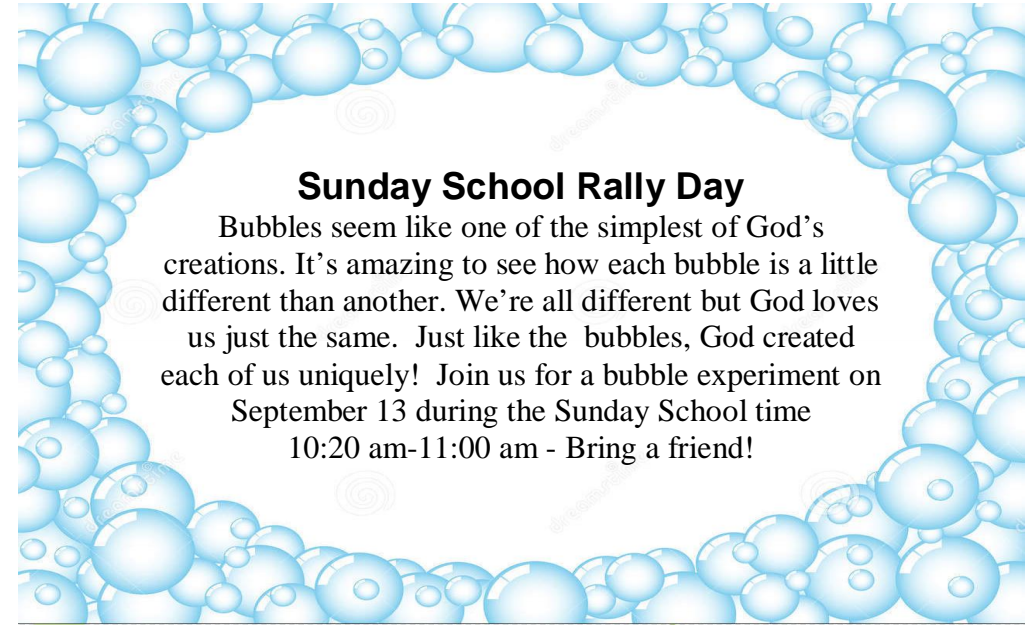
