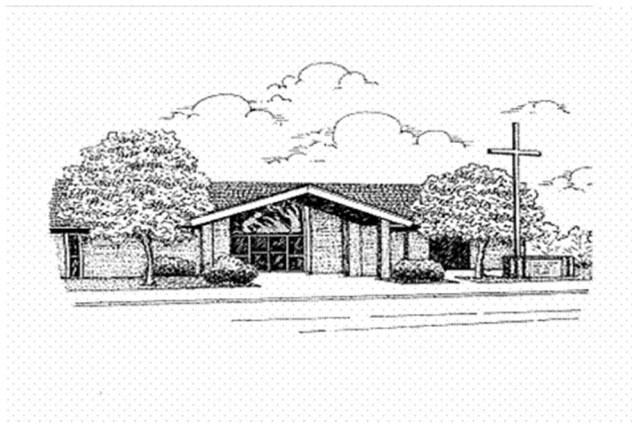

Today's Reading Summaries

A summary theme for the appointed readings today (3/19) is: *We Worship the Father of Our Lord Jesus Christ in the Spirit and Truth of His Gospel*. Though the Lord had brought them out of Egypt, "all the congregation of the people of Israel" grumbled against Him because "there was no water for the people to drink" (Ex. 17:1). Despite their quarreling, the Lord graciously provided for them. He did not strike the people for their sins, but by the hand of Moses He struck the rock instead and brought forth water for the people. In the same way, living water flows from the pierced side of Christ at "about the sixth hour" (John 4:6, 19:14), when He is lifted up on the cross for the sins of the world. He is "the gift of God" (John 4:10), the well from which the Holy Spirit is poured out and becomes in His people "a spring of water welling up to eternal life" (John 4:14). By this grace in which we stand, being at peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, we "worship the Father in spirit and truth" (John 4:23). "We rejoice in hope of the glory of God" because "God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us" (Rom. 5:2, 5).

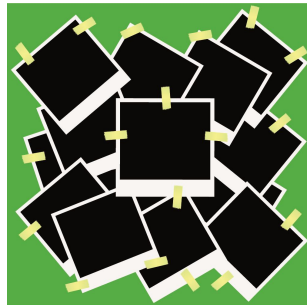

Property Team

The team met on 3/9/17.

- Sidewalk repairs due to cracks and uplifted sections. The Council will be asked to approve the expenditure of Capital funds for the repair (\$5,497)
- One of our members, Cameron Loesche, is considering a project at church for his Eagle Scout project. The team has proposed he work on some of our planter areas.
- The ground drain for our east facing Sanctuary roof is plugged and will be repaired.
- Re-keying several areas of the church has been done. A full re-key will be proposed for the next Capital Fund drive in order to provide a proper master key system.
- A handrail will be developed and installed for the back steps to the Chancel.
- The fixed nursery divider door needs a better system to secure it. The team is working on this issue.
- Some of the windows in the Sanctuary need to be sealed. It will happen soon.
- The large BBQ grill needs to be replaced. It is hoped to purchase 2 covered gas units in the near future.
- The fluorescent ceiling lights will gradually be replaced with LED units. The team is looking into the options, beginning with the office.
- The team reviewed its outcomes

- The team prepared a budget request for the 2017-2018 budget.
