



Sunday Worship Next Week at GSLC

Next Sunday (5/22) is Trinity Sunday, the day we emphasize that our God is one God in three persons, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The appointed Scripture readings for that day are: Proverbs 8:1-4, 22 -31; Psalm 8; Acts 2:14a, 22-36; John 8:48-59. The Praise Band will lead the music at 9:00 a.m. The organist will lead the music at 11:00 a.m. The Chancel Choir will provide music at the 11:00 a.m. service.

The BIG Big Band from Sweden

They are coming back! We have hosted this band 2 times in the past. During their first visit they performed at CSUS in the outdoor amphitheater. The last time they performed at the Turlock Community Theater. They are returning on Tuesday, June 21. They will perform at the Turlock Covenant Church, which is co-hosting the band with our congregation. This is a very talented music group that has a variety of music styles. All ages will enjoy them. Usually a "big band" has seventeen players. The BIG Big Band from Sweden, coming to Turlock Covenant Church on June 21, 2016 at 7:00 PM, has 63 instrumentalists. We've heard that this is the "biggest big band in the world". They will present a concert at Turlock Covenant Church on June 21, 2016. This is a Christian band. Make plans to be there.

The Puzzle Pieces

During the worship service on May 1, I gave each of the 10 Confirmation students a puzzle piece and asked them to put them together after the service in the Social Hall. They assembled the puzzle on the table next to their cake. Each piece is to remind them of their part of the class and our congregation. If they are missing, the puzzle is incomplete. The picture on the puzzle is of a cement mixer. That represents the importance of a good foundation as a Christian, which those 10 students now have. They have completed four years of studying God's Word. That puzzle will be placed on the bulletin board in the Narthex as a reminder of the importance of those 10 young people. Bylaw Revision

The bylaws for our Endowment need to be revised in order to clarify how we nominate people to serve on that committee. The revision will be presented for a vote after our Congregational Meeting on May 18. The revision assigns the nomination procedure to the Church Council. The current bylaw does not state who is responsible for that procedure. This is the proposed revision: Three members of the congregation, nominated from the congregation through the Council, elected by the Voters, for a

two-year term and subject to re-election for one additional two-year term. The italics, underlined section is the proposed addition.

Today's Readings Summaries

A summary theme for the appointed readings today (5/15) is: The Holy Spirit Gives Peace. Following the flood, Noah's descendants failed to spread out and fill the earth as God had spoken. Rather, they exalted themselves; with "one language and the same words" (Gen. 11:1) they spoke proudly and arrogantly. The Lord humbled them by confusing "the language of all the earth," dividing and dispersing the people (Gen. 11:9). That dispersal was reversed on Pentecost Day (the fiftieth day of Easter), when God caused the one Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ to be preached in a multitude of languages. "At this sound the multitude came together" (Acts 2:6), for the preaching of Christ is the primary work of the Holy Spirit, whereby He gathers people from all nations into one Church. The Holy Spirit teaches and brings to our remembrance the words of Jesus, which are the words of the Father who sent Him. These words bestow forgiveness and peace to those who keep and hold on to them in love for Jesus. "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid." (John 14:27).
